



ESL COMMUNITY USION

CFSL BASELINE STANDARDS

- Uphold both university policy, student code of conduct, and state and federal laws
- Accurately report all active and new members in the appropriate timeframe (end of Spring & Fall)
- Only pledge/initiate enrolled UH students who meet your organization's/governing council's requirements
- Attendance at all governing council meetings
- Full participation in the Fraternal Excellence Program (All narratives and interviews)
- A minimum once per month meeting with your 'Chapter Coach'
- Participation in the Fraternity/Sorority Presidents Leadership Summit and other required programming

CFSL BASELINE STANDARDS

- Chapters who are unable to meet baseline expectations will **not** be provided access to the following:
 - Departmental sponsorship (outdoor events, and specific on campus locations)
 - Letters of good standing (Intake verification, chartering, etc.)
- 'Baseline Standards' notification letters are sent out at the close of each semester/beginning of the following semester
- Chapters who fail to meet 'Baseline Standards' the previous semester will also not be eligible for participation in both Cat's Back AND Greek-a-Palooza

MPORTANTDATES

ON CAMPUS EVENTS

Indoor events in a managed venue like the Student Centers, follow the general event registration process with a reservation from CARS (including a Risk Management Matrix, and COVID checklist form they provide) AND the Get Involved event registration at least 5 business days in advance (or 15 business days for social events). Events taking place outdoors with more than 10 people in attendance or in a non-managed venue, must follow a different process and be reviewed by the University Events Screening Committee in addition to the standard room reservation and Get Involved event registration.

BAYOU EVENTS

We are not approving any social events with alcohol, philanthropy events, or other large-scale programs (50+) to be hosted within the Bayou Oaks townhomes for Fall 2021. For scheduled events that are being held in Bayou Oaks outside of the house, groups need to complete the Bayou Oaks Special Events Form (at least 5 business days in advance) and will need to also complete 'Event Exception Request Form' since Bayou Oaks is not a managed venue if the attendance will exceed 10 people. The Event Exception Form needs to be submitted at least 10 business days before the event takes place.

FRATERNAL EXCELLENCE PROGRAM

FEP PROCESS

The Fraternal Excellence Program is an effort by the University of Houston Fraternity and Sorority Community to integrate the core principles of fraternity/sorority membership into our campus-based awards and assessment program.

FULL PARTICIPATION

Full participation is defined as submission of narratives **AND** interviews in at least three areas.

Chapters who fail to submit narratives or participate in all interviews will be considered 'Below Baseline Standards'

NARRATIVE SUBMISSION

Due November 8th

Chapters will be required to submit narrative responses.

These will be submitted through a specific form provided online through Get Involved.

A rubric is available detailing exactly what the evaluator is looking for in each area.

CHARACTER INTERVIEWS

Due December 15th

Chapter presidents will receive a listing of their assigned interview evaluators through email.

Chapter presidents or their designee are responsible for managing the completion of these interviews which can be done in person or virtually.


