AAS 2396 introduces students to major issues, events, socio-political and ideological forces that shaped the *evolution* of educational opportunities for Blacks in the United States. The course helps students understand *where Black education began* and *where it is today*. It also examines the history of Black education from the perspective that Black people have always used education to advance Black life, advocate for Black communities, and advance Black people toward independence. By connecting education and Black studies together, the course provides critical information about key moments in *Black history from antiquity to the present* when education has been used to inspire the Black masses. Moreover, the course inspires students to use their education to actively engage in making a positive difference in the Black community.
