

Wadie E. Said is Professor of Law at the University of South Carolina School of Law. He is the author of *Crimes of Terror* (Oxford, 2015), along with numerous articles in major law journals. Before joining the South Carolina faculty, he represented terrorist suspects as an assistant federal public defender in Tampa, Florida, serving as counsel in *United States v. al-Arian*, one of the largest terrorism prosecutions in American history. A graduate of Princeton University and Columbia Law School, he clerked for Chief Judge Charles P. Sifton of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of New York.
