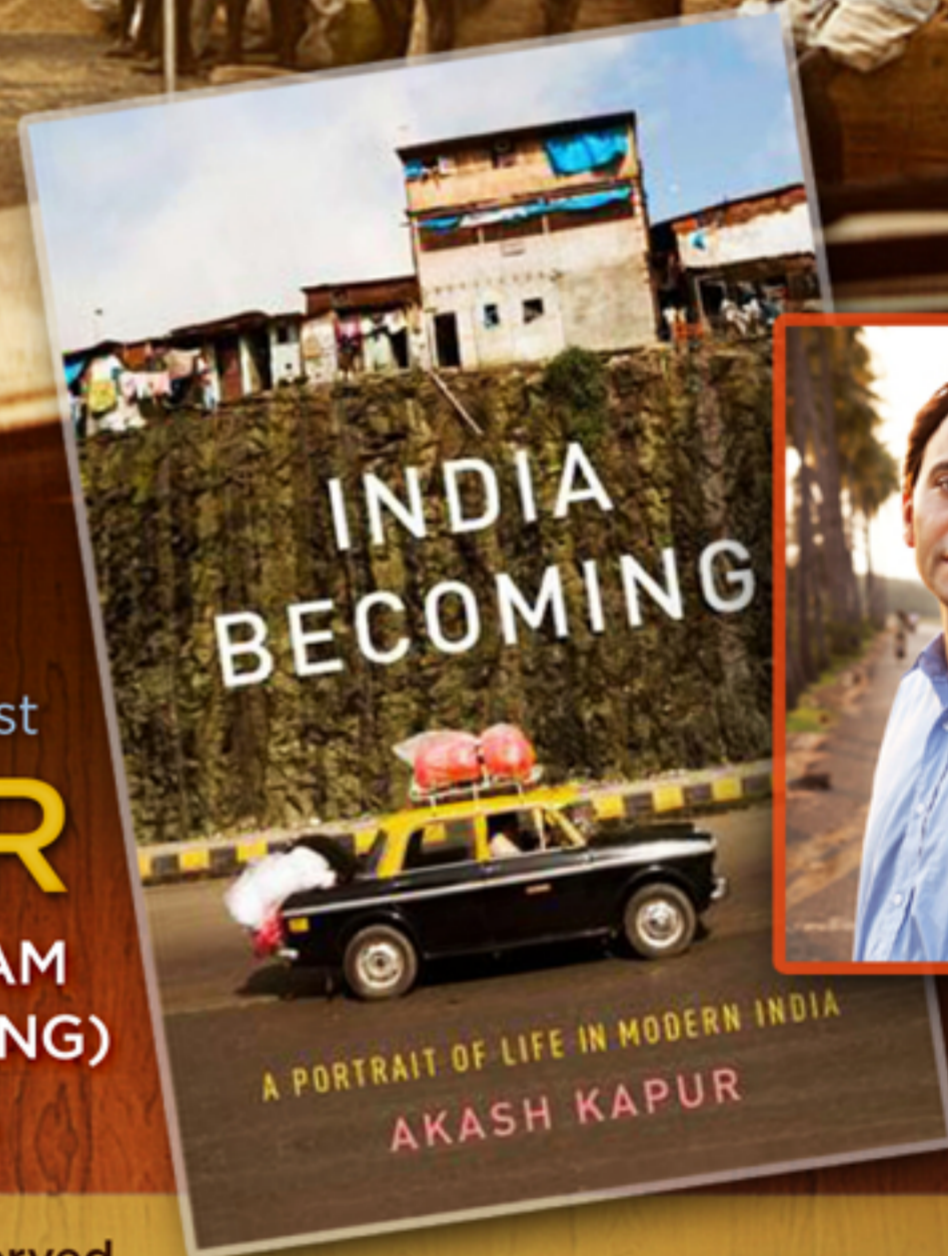

He used to write a fortnightly "Letter from India" column for the International Herald Tribune. The column also ran occasionally in the Week in Review section of The New York Times.

Akash has a bachelor's degree from Harvard University in Social Anthropology, and a DPhil (as a Rhodes Scholar) at Nuffield College, Oxford University.
