COMBAT WATER SURVIVAL TEST (CWST)

The Army Combat Water Survival Test (CWST) is a test that measures a Cadet's stamina in the water while completing a series of events in OCPs. CWST consist of the following events:

• 5-MINUTE TREAD

Cadets must tread water for five minutes without touching the bottom or sides of the pool.

• 15-METER SWIM

Cadets must be able to swim 15 meters without touching the sides or bottom of the pool while wearing a fighting load carrier vest (FLC) and carrying a M-4.

EQUIPMENT DITCH

Cadets have on a FLC and hold a M-4. From the side of the pool, the Cadet must step backwards into the water. The Cadet must be completely submerged underwater as he/she drops the rifle and removes the vest.

3-METER DROP

Cadets must walk blindfolded off a 3-meter high diving board while carrying a M-4. They must hold on to the M-14 at all times, remove the blindfold, and then swim to the side of the pool.

• 10-MINUTE SWIM

Last, Cadets must first swim laps for ten minutes without touching the sides or bottom of the pool.

NORWEGIAN FOOT MARCH







The Norwegian Foot March or Road March badge (Norwegian Marsjmerket) is a Norwegian Armed forces skill badge. 13 Cadets participated and had to complete a 18.6 mile in full uniform with a 25lb ruck sack in 4.5 hours or less. Not only did the Cadets complete the foot march and earn their pin, they placed 3rd place overall from a total of 9 schools who competed.
