SHRL Will Positively Influence Student Success

Architect a Student Leadership Portal

A SHRL program proposal and evaluation module were fully implemented during summer 2018. For AY 2018 – 2019, a total of 383 programs were submitted. For Fall 2019 term a total of 130 programs were submitted. The student staff application module for the RA Recruitment and Selection Process was implemented in Spring 2020. 969 students utilized the portal to check-in for RA Interest Sessions. 396 of these students completed an application to be an RA. To further this work a Living Learning Community application process has also been created in Mercury.

Learning Communities

SHRL has partnered with faculty for the Minority Male Leadership Living Learning Community. In addition, there has been faculty involvement regarding the planning for the Living Learning Communities within the Quad Townhouses.

Student Staff Recruitment & Selection Review

All selection documents including position descriptions, individual interview questions, and evaluations were updated to emphasize the competencies of leadership, critical thinking, diversity, and personal growth.

Establish Learning Outcomes for SHRL Student Staff/Leaders

The Community Mentor Training Committee was charged to implement the first phase of Goal #2. A fall 2019 training (August 5-9, 12, 13) experience was designed that was intentional in covering the Scarlet Seals of Excellence Competency areas. Toward the end, sessions were structured to provide balance in covering the following competencies: Diversity, Leadership, Personal Development, and, Thinking & Communication.

ALUMNI OUTREACH



Build Alumni and Friends Engagement Opportunities

SHRL successfully planned and executed our first Alumni and friends Homecoming tailgate in November 2019. Two newsletters were sent to the Housing Alumni and Friends email list on January 24, 2020 and July 1,2020. An Alumni and Friends event for the Quad will be discussed for implementation in Spring 2021.

The Quad Construction has reached completion and residents moved into the residential hall in August 2020.

Moody Towers Replacement

SHRL worked with UH Planning and consultants to complete a Tower replacement program. At this time SHRL is working with UH planning and consultants to study a renovation options to potentially better meet the affordability goal. This renovation study was completed in August 2020, indicating that a renovation is possible. The next phase of this project is to complete an initial cost analysis and determine if a Moody Renovation will move forward. This next step will be completed by January 2021.

MONETARY



Fundraising for Construction and/or Cougar Experience Scholars

On November 1, 2019 a journal entry was executed to transfer \$35,988 to the Cougar Experience Scholarship Fund. This

amount represents 3% of all Conference Housing and Guest Housing revenue for the 2018/2019 Academic Year. The Quad Mailbox and limestone cube fundraising project were launched in 2019 with a total donation amount, as of January 2020, of \$19,796.00. We are currently looking at a partnership with UH Alumni on a fundraise for the Quad Courtyards in the new Quad construction project.

Rate Structure

The annual evaluation of current rates, market study, and peer institutions was completed in September 2019 for Academic Year 2020/2021. An anticipated 3% rate increase is being proposed. In February 2020 SHRL will present rate forums for the residential community to review the proposed increases.

DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION EFFORTS

UH Student Housing and Residential Life (SHRL) continued to serve the students within the Minority Male Living Learning Community through direct mentoring and discussions related to their success.

SHRL utilized various different diverse recruiting organizations in an attempt to recruiting a diverse applicant pool for several vacant positions.

SHRL updated residential facilities and emergency protocols to ensure they are accessible to all students within the residential community.

MARKETING





Weekly Video Series

The weekly video series titled, "In the Loop", launched on February 3, 2020 and is distributed each Monday to all current residents during the academic year. The video is shared on the SHRL social media channels and is included in the department's monthly email newsletter. In the Loop continues to be distributed during the fall 2020 semester.

Semester Recap Videos

The department distributed one semester recap video on December 16, 2019. The video included photos and video footage of major SHRL events such as Cougar Move-In, • campus events such as Winter Wonderland, and featured residents enjoying events in their halls. There was no spring semester recap video created since the campus transitioned to remote learning and activities in the spring 2020 semester.

ENVIRONMENTAL

Maintain and Enhance Physical Space

The facilities assessment plan has been reviewed and updated as necessary annually. This is evidenced in the public area space refresh which was planned in University Lofts along with an outdoor living room project for Cougar Village. Sustainability efforts planned for spring 2020 were suspended due to the university and state stay at home order.

In order to help mitigate the community spread of COVID-19, Student Housing and Residential Life engaged virtually with the residential community in the following ways:

- Utilized Microsoft teams for virtual engagement with our residential populations.
- Collaborated with UH Facilities to develop a standardized room disinfecting process for all residential facilities.
- Provided continued support and service to the approximately 1500 students who remained on campus this spring semester through the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Continued outreach to new and returning students with information about student housing in the fall.
- Established a process to house and support residents who may need to self-isolate related to COVID-19.
- Offered 10 virtual events held by our Faculty in Residence.
- Presented a virtual student leader and student staff awards recognition event called the SHRLies, celebrating 27 winners in 20 categories.
- Adapted quickly to the pandemic with adjusted processes, protocols, and Personal Protective Equipment for all our staff so they could continue to support students and their success.



Student Housing & Residential Life has initiated a partnership with the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences (CLASS) on two new Living Learning Communities (LLCs). These LLCs are slated to open in the new residence hall, The Quad, in fall 2020. This partnership continues to support the division/department strategic plan, which values academic affairs-student affairs partnerships and student success.



University of Houston Student Housing & Residential Life and Sam Houston State University Residence Life departments co-hosted the SWACUHO Annual Conference in Sugar Land, Texas February 2020. This conference showcased both departments and schools to the SWACUHO region (Oklahoma, Arkansas, Texas), as well as recognized the hard work of individuals from both departments who served on the conference planning committee.



Student Housing & Residential Life staff represent both the department and the University of Houston. Two staff members serve on national committees for NASPA, NACURH, ACUHO-I. and RMS. while eleven staff members serve on regional committees for SWACUHO and SACSA. Staff involvement in these various committees help share the story of SHRL and UH, while giving back to the respective professional organizations.



The Student Housing & Residential Life Marketing Team won third place in the Website category at the 2019 ACUHO-I Business Operations Conference Marketing Awards. This award not only recognizes the newly launched website and the team that created it, it allows Student Housing & Residential Life to share their story on a national level with anticipated new traffic to the website from across the country.

Community Mentor Training

August 2019 and January 2020 Community Mentor training schedules will be created with sessions/presentations that have learning outcomes based in the Scarlet Seals of Excellence Competency Areas:

- Diversity: developing knowledge, skills, and activism that supports and understands cultures and community engagement
- Leadership: developing a personal philosophy of leadership that includes the understanding of self, others, and community with responsibilities inherent to community membership
- Personal Development: understanding and developing who you are and how who you are intersects with others and groups
- Thinking and Communication: developing skills and knowledge about how one thinks, solves problems, demonstrates creativity, and communicates

Supports Student Housing & Residential Life Goal: Student Staff Training

The learning outcomes for CM training were well documented within the training schedule. Based on the information collected in the survey and through the evaluations of the Behind Closed Doors activity during Community Mentor training, the established learning outcomes were achieved. Retention and understanding of the material was high; however, for next year's training, more emphasis on the coaching conversation skills will be essential to the continued development and success of the Community Mentor program. Additional interactive practice and knowledge application activities in the form of case studies, presentations, and role playing scenarios are currently in development for implementation in the Fall 2020 Community Mentor Training schedule.





Resident Advisor Student Leader Position

As a result of serving as a Resident Advisor (RA), RAs will gain leadership qualities by positively impacting residential students through meaningful interactions.

The purpose of this assessment is to determine what experiences are having the most impact on the RA's perception of their experience and how they are making meaning of those experiences. Further, this assessment will serve as a baseline year of knowledge for understanding what leadership skills the RAs believe they are developing through their RA experience.



Residence Halls Association Student Learning

As the Executive Board Members of Residence Halls Association (RHA), the students are the voice of the residence hall population though policy development, advocacy, committee service, and programming. The desired outcome is that the RHA executive board members will be able to reflect on their growth in leadership skills through the day-to-day experiences they are having in the position and increase their self-perceived ability in leadership skills. That growth will then inform their future, as they matriculate through UH and begin to apply for post-graduation employment, graduate school, and/or other leadership opportunities.

The purpose of this assessment activity is to learn how each individual has developed through their specific experiences, challenges, and positions. There are 5 executive board members in RHA, each of which have individual job responsibilities. This assessment activity will help us define which experiences are impacting their learning.






Number of Conduct Cases






Alleged Conduct Cases by Area - Spring 2019
