Career Fair FAQs frequently asked questions



Q: What is a career fair?

A: A Career Fair is an event where employers and students can **meet to discuss potential internship or career opportunities**. During a Career Fair employers will stand at booths and students will walk around the event, stopping at booths to briefly introduce themselves to the employer, express interest in the company and give their resume.

Q: Why should I go to a career fair?

A: Employers are coming because they want to recruit University of Houston talent!

They want to meet you and learn about your skills, interests and abilities! You should come to the fair to: (1) Meet employers and establish employment contacts (2) Obtain internship or employment opportunities (3) Learn more about companies you are interested in (4) Develop and practice your communication skills





Q: What should I bring?

A: 10-15 copies of your updated resume, business cards (if you have them), mints (no gum) and arrive 30 minutes before the fair begins if you are able

Q: What should I wear?

A: Professional dress is strictly enforced. View our Dress Code policy before attending. If you do not have business professional attire, schedule a "Career Closet" appointment in Cougar Pathway and you can rent a suit for three business days for \$10.





Q: Do I have to pay to attend?

A: No! All Career Fairs hosted by University Career Services are **free** of charge for UH students and alumni.

Q: Who can attend?

A: University Career Services career fairs are open to all currently enrolled UH students and alumni. We encourgaed currently enrolled students and alumni subscribers to RSVP for the event through Cougar Pathway. Non-alumni subscribers will be able to register the day of the event.
