# **IV PeopleSoft update:**

Grading: This is the last major event of the semester.

Faculty may change grades on-line between December 18<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>. After that they must complete Course Record Adjustment Forms to change a grade.

An e-mail communication to students about grades is being developed.

It is currently possible to see the number of rosters and their completion rate.

Currently being written is a report so that designated individuals in colleges and departments may see what grading has been completed on-line, including grades for individual courses.

#### **Special Topics and Special Problems courses:**

Similar to the Instruction Type on a course, the Grading Basis on the "child" must match the "parent" course.

**E-mailing from class list:** The PeopleSoft Project Team is aware of problems and have worked out solutions.

It can be expected that there will be bounce back messages in doing this. Students do not always update their e-mail addresses with us.

V Spring 2008 Registration Report: 22,153 students have registered for Spring 2008. This is a little behind past years, but it is hard to compare because the enrollment calendar is a little different this year.

Payment deadline is January 8, 2007.

**Scheduling for Summer and Fall 2008** begins next week with a meeting of the College Schedulers. This is the first in a series of meetings that will address the schedule and use of the new software, AdAstra.

Spring 2008 Final Exam Schedule: does not appear to be on-line.

# VI Fall 2008 Admissions and Recruitment: Admissions:

Applied: 4,296 FTIC and Transfer applications Admitted: 1,153 at this time. Down a little from last year (1,438).

# **Recruitment:**

 Currently recruiting actively for Fall 2008 and Spring 2009. Recruiting for Spring 2008 transfer students is on-going also.
 Misconceptions in community are an issue. People have a negative perception of UH.

# **Quality and Quantity:**

Admissions does not set policy.

There is a review committee for those applicants that fall below the 50<sup>th</sup> percentile. Admissions personnel and 3-4 faculty meet each Friday to discuss those applicants. If you are interested in helping in the effort, please let Josie Anderson or Jeff Fuller know.

In 2006 the SAT scores were 70 points above the 2005 class and a higher proportion of the 2006 class was above the top  $50^{\text{th}}$  percentile.

VII Achieving the Dream: Coaches and top community colleges (HCC, San Jacinto, Lone Star College (formerly NHMCCD), Wharton, Alvin) representatives were here earlier this week. Two students also met with this group.
