V Orientation Report:

In 2006 the consultant that studied our orientation program observed: Reservation process was confusing Testing was incomplete when students arrived for orientation Orientation was optional Schedule was overwhelming Redundancy in speakers

The Orientation Task Force (OTF) was established as a result of the consultant's report. Agnes DeFranco and Myra Connolly co-chair the task force.

Fall 2007:

Reservations are now done online Testing is completed online before students may register for classes Orientation is mandatory

Meeting Handouts: Orientation Resource Guide (UC 9778 08F) and Preliminary Statistics for Fall 2008 Orientation (UC 9779 08F).

The mid-Fall Orientation was scheduled for the Friday before Hurricane Ike. It has been rescheduled to October 13-14.

Noted Improvements: Math Placement Testing and TSI stops worked well this year. Most students left campus registered for classes.

Evaluations were administered at the CougarOne card office, while they waited for their ID to print.

If colleges or departments was statistics specific to their area they should contact Patrick Daniel.

Plans for a follow-up survey are being made. Dr. Velez and Prof. Bott have offered time their freshmen classes for survey purposes.

The fee for orientation is added to the Fall fee bill. \$120 for 2 day conference \$60 for 1 day conference This money supports the orientation program.

International students have a separate orientation.

A family program runs the same time as the student program. Most of the first morning of orientation parents and student spend together in sessions.

Eliminating USD complete is unlikely, but we can get the numbers down significantly.

Best practices at peer institutions are being collected and reviewed.

Undeclared students have the worst retention and graduation rates. Engaged students do much better.

Most USD students are there because they couldn't get into their major of choice, not because they chose to be USD.

Expansion of major offerings and alternative majors are being looked at. "3 minor program" How many majors do we have? Why isn't that enough?
