**New Business (Chair Larry Williams):**

- A** In order to keep in line with UH's "green" effort, hardcopy documents for Undergraduate Council consideration will no longer be mailed out to Council members. Instead, members

may review documents on the UC website tracking page. The only exception will be that the DPC-CB3 will have hardcopies because of the large volume of documents that have to be reviewed. Otherwise, going paperless for the most part will save time and money.

- B** Faculty Senate met about HB 2504 compliance (i.e., publishing syllabi, CVs, etc on-line for the public).

UH Administration decided not to implement course evaluations on-line unless departments want to do this.

There is a template that the Accountability Task Force put together for Syllabi & CVs which will be coming out soon. Larry Williams would like to see UC input regarding this template.

- C** Provost John Antel sent out a memo regarding the new Freshman Year Instructional Task Force (a broader based taskforce of 7 members). Chair Larry Williams expressed that he would rather see a more specific-based task force. Certain goals such as increasing first year graduation rates and increased rates of classes taken in the first year would be among the issues discussed. He would like the task force to work on improving student success in DFW courses as well. The main goal of this task force is not to reinvent the wheel on ideas on improving student success.

Would like to see Institutional Research information on typical first year classes, develop core faculty to teach these classes and would like the UC to provide input on who should teach these classes. Also, discuss "teaching" in the classrooms.

UC member, Miranda Bennett informed the Council that on November 6th (12noon) @ the University Center, QEP grants workshop will be held (hosted by Faculty Senate & Marshall Schott's department.). Miranda felt that this event could be informative to improving student success. An email regarding this even will be sent in the next couple of days.

Chair Larry Williams and the Council members continued to discuss the many ways that student success can be improved.
